Dear Parish Family,

As we continue to explore the history and theology of the Mass, we should now discuss "Where did the structure and prayers of the Mass originate?" The easy answer is that the Mass is handed down to us by Christ, through His Church, down through the centuries. It is an organic and living reality, so from time to time, it is necessary to revise and refocus the Mass, weeded out any abuses that have crept into common practice, and continuously seek to offer the most reverent and worthy prayer to the Father through Christ that we can. Okay, so not really an "easy" answer, but certainly the shorter one. The expanded answer is that the early Church merged together the worship of the synagogue & temple from the time of Christ. In the synagogue, the scriptures were read, the scholars taught, and the psalms were prayed. This is quite similar to what we do during the first half of the Mass, now called the Liturgy of the Word. In the temple, sacrifices of atonement or thanksgiving were prepared & offered, prayers were said by the priest that the people might be blessed by God, and other rituals were performed. Is that not the same things that we do during the second half of the Mass, called the Liturgy of the Eucharist? When changes were made to the Mass, it was never a rejection of what had been done in the past, but was usually an adjustment to aid the Church in both understanding what was happening during the Mass and help

us to pray better. Since it is the case that the Mass is not something that we "own", we don't have the authority or freedom to change it. Instead, the Mass is supposed to be a point of unity for the entire Church. This is why the "norms" or "instructions" for the Mass are universal. Special exemptions are made from the norms sometimes. Here in the United States, it is allowable to receiving communion standing or in the hand. Yet, the norm for the Church is still to receive communion kneeling & on the tongue. Next week, I will speak more about both the universal norms & the local exceptions allowed in the USA. ~Fr. Shaw
