Sunday of the 2nd Week of Ordinary Time

January 20th, 2019

Dear Parish Family,

This weekend, we continue with our ongoing parish catechesis on the parts of the Mass that every Catholic should be able to say in Latin. As a reminder, we started this about two years ago as I attempt to be faithful to the call of the bishops at the 2nd Vatican Council to make sure that all the Faithful could pray their parts of the Mass in Latin. While permitting translations into the vernacular, i.e. in our everyday spoken language, the Council said that "care must be taken to ensure that the faithful may also be able to say or sing together in Latin those parts of the Ordinary of the Mass which pertain to them." (SC 36, 54) So, the Council plainly insisted on keeping some Latin in the Mass. I appreciate the struggle that it can be to learn how to pray in a language that is unfamiliar to someone. I have had to go through that very experience twice, first with Latin and again with

Spanish. I am not a linguist by nature or interest, but I learned how to pray the Mass in these languages, both as an offering to God and to expand the ways I can serve the people of God in the Diocese of Charlotte. Many might say that they don't understand the words, but that isn't completely true, is it? You know the prayer in English or Spanish, and for the next few weeks, you'll be exposed to it in another language. The words mean the same, we are just saying them a bit differently. Please be patient as we learn over the next few weeks first how to pronounce the words. Whenever we exert more effort into our prayer and worship of God, it's an opportunity for Grace, so let us embrace all that the Lord gives us for showing our love for Him in a new way!

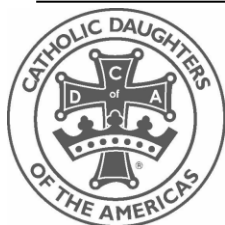
