Sunday of the 30th, Week in Ordinary Time

Dear Parish Family,

Since we as Catholics belong to the one Church, founded by Christ, we are called to live the Faith in a united fashion as one family. Within families different traditions can emerge, but they usually have common elements. For us, who are Catholics of the Latin Church, we have the Mass offered according to the Roman Rite. Within the Latin Church, there are different rites (Mozarabic Rite of Toledo [Spain], Ambrosian Rite of Milan [Italy], Bragan Rite of Braga [Portugal], Sarum Rite from Salsbury [England]) yet all of those rites developed out of the way that the Mass was offered in Rome (the Old Roman Rite that was in use until the 5th-8th century). Localized, minor adjustments to the Mass were fairly common throughout Church until the 16th century. Because of the ceremonies that the Protestants were developing, the Church decided to limit and unify the way that the Mass was offered, so that a Catholic could know and tell the difference between a valid, Catholic Mass and one of the Protestant ceremonies. Therefore, today, we have one set of instructions, called *rubrics*, for the Roman Rite of the Latin Church. It helps to

provide unity of worship. Yet, the Church also knows that different cultures have different understandings when it comes to symbols & rituals. For example, black is considered the color of mourning in the Western world, so black vestments were the standard color of vestments for funerals of adults in the West as the Church wanted to express Her solidarity, her closeness to the family who was mourning the death of a loved one. This symbol doesn't work in Asian cultures, since the color of mourning for them is white. Hence, the Church in recent time has allowed for white vestments at funerals, again to show the closeness of the Church with those who are mourning. Sometimes, misinformation and misinterpretations happen when some of these exceptions happen. That is why the Church always has the option to stop the exception so that the true message might be known again. Some practices can be even more local. In the 1970's, when the Mass was revised, a universal norm was given that after the "Lamb of God/ Angus Dei" everyone would remain standing. The bishops of the USA were given an exception so that all would again kneel until the Blessed Sacrament is placed in the Tabernacle. *More on this next week!* ~Fr. Shaw
