Sunday of the 32nd Week in Ordinary Time

Dear Parish Family,

Building off last week's bulletin message, we return to the idea that there are things that have happened with the Mass that perhaps we haven't received the entirety of the Church's teaching. Two major points that have drawn a great deal of controversy & attention are the language the Mass is offered and the direction the priest faces during Mass. Beyond what individual preferences or opinions might be on these topics, the more important point is to know & understand what the Church says about them.

When discussing the language of the Mass offered in the ordinary form of the Roman Rite, the Church is very clear of what the universal norm is: "The use of the Latin language is to be preserved in the Latin Rite." (Sacrosanctum Concilium, 36) The bishops of Vatican II wanted to make sure that the culture, traditions, & language of the Latin Church would be maintained. The primary way of doing that is by keeping Latin as the primary language of the Mass throughout the Church. A priest never needs permission from the Vatican or his bishop to offer Mass in Latin. Yet, the bishops of Vatican II also saw the potential benefit of having parts of the Mass offered in the language common

to the people where a Mass is offered. The initial idea was that the prayers that change each week and the readings could be done in a vernacular language. It was never the intention of the bishops to have the entire Mass done in the vernacular. They wanted to make sure that Latin did not disappear from the liturgies of the Latin Church, so much so that they mandated: "...steps should be taken so that the faithful may also be able to say or to sing together in Latin those parts of the Ordinary of the Mass which pertain to them" (SC, 54). In my life & experience, this part of the council has not been even communicated to most people. So, at faithful to the desire of Vatican II, this Advent season at St. Joseph's, we will begin doing the "Agnus Dei" ("Lamb of God") in Latin. This isn't out of some notion to "roll things back", rather it is a desire to be faithful to what the Church says I should be doing as a pastor and to help all of us to better worship as members of the Church. ~Fr.
