### *Sunday of the 33<sup>rd</sup> Week in Ordinary Time*

*November 13<sup>th</sup>, 2016*

Dear Parish Family,

Continuing from last week, we will be moving through all the parts of the Mass that you, as the Laity, are responsible for knowing. These parts include the "Holy, Holy, Holy", the "Mystery of Faith", the "Lamb of God", the Lord's Prayer, the Creed, and the short dialogues between the priest & the laity ("The Lord be with you...and with your spirit.", the exchange before and after the readings & the Gospel, and the Preface dialogue). I know it's a lot to learn and it will take time, but there's no rush to learn all of this. We won't move to another part until I am reasonably sure that we have spent enough time learning the current part. As you can imagine, this process will take a good amount of time. The beneficial part of going through this will be that if you go to Mass with the Holy Father, you'll be able to understand the parts that are usually done in Latin. In the grand scheme of things, the idea of this also reflects one of Marks of the Church: Unity. Through the use of a common language across different cultures, places, and even eras, the Latin Church reflects the fundamental attribute that we are called to be united in our

worship of God through the Mass as those who belong to the Roman Rite of the Latin Catholic Church. Additionally, one of the misconceptions that we can easily fall into is that we completely understand what happens during the Mass. We can have a good understanding, and we should, but there is always the aspect that we need to have a healthy respect of the profound mystery that we are invited into when we are at Mass. God is working a miracle before our eyes. By using an ancient, sacred language like Latin (or even Greek in some cases), we connect with that reality more readily. This is not just my musings, but ideas that have been expressed from the earliest writings of the Church, even to the very recent writings of Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI and Cardinal Sarah (the Cardinal in charge of the Congregation for Divine Worship). As I have said before, the more we know about the Mass, the better we can pray during the Mass. *Next week: On the direction the priest faces during Mass ~Fr. Shaw*
