Sunday of the 5th Week in Ordinary Time February 9th, 2020

Dear Parish Family,

Continuing the theme of devotional practices, this Sunday marks that we are two and a half weeks from Ash Wednesday and seven weeks from Easter. Customarily, it would be around this time that the Church would encourage people to start preparing for the Lenten season by introspection, self-reflection on one's spiritual life, by asking a simple, but important question: "What is one area of vice in my life, one area that I specifically struggle to stop doing something sinful or embrace doing something virtuous?" Finding one vice and committing ourselves to battling against and overcoming it this Lent is a great way to spend the Sacred season of Lent. While getting rid of a sinful weakness is important, we must also strive to practice the virtue that is opposed to the vice. Classically, the seven deadly sins are each associated with a virtue: Lust & Faith, Envy & Hope, Sloth & Charity, Pride & Prudence, Greed & Justice, Gluttony & Temperance, Anger & Perseverance.

So, we start preparing now by being honest with ourselves and putting together a plan for this Lent. By doing this, our Lent will be clearly focused a struggle that leads to lasting Holiness, just like Our Lord's own Passion & Death! ~ Fr. Shaw
