Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity

June 16th, 2019

Dear Parish Family,

As we emerge from the celebrations of the Easter season and start to become immersed into "Tempus Per Annum" (poorly translated as "Ordinary Time"), there might be a temptation to think that this is the uninteresting or blasé part of the year for the Church. Of course, when speaking of the mysteries of the Faith, nothing is uninteresting or blasé! I would propose that many of us need to tweak our thinking about the cycle of the Church calendar: there is an internal unity to it highlighting the different persons of the Most Holy Trinity, whom we honor & give glory to today. In the season of Advent, we focus on God, the Father, Whose great love brought us into being, sustains us after the fall, and who sent His dearly Beloved Son into this world to Save & Redeem us. From Christmas until the Ascension, we focus on God, the Son. From His Nativity until His Ascension, His visible presence and works point us back to the Father, accomplish our reconciliation through His life, death, & resurrection, as well as prepare us for the coming of the Holy Spirit. Finally, from Pentecost until

Christ the King Sunday, we are focusing on the Holy Spirit, who descended upon those gathered in the upper room and continues to be our source of grace, strength, and perseverance in our present age. He does all of this to prepare us for the return of the Son, our Divine King, at the end of time. In turn, the Son will hand all things over to the Father, thus bring the plan of our salvation to its end and inaugurating the restored perfect unity between God & mankind. During these next twenty-four weeks, let us not allow an apathy or lukewarm-ness to settle into our hearts. Rather, let us call upon the Holy Spirit, upon whom we should be focusing during this time, to fill our hearts, kindle in them the fire of His love, so that He renews the face of the earth."
